Court fines and costs are due **today**! Payment methods include:

- cash
- check
- money order
- credit card online only

If you cannot pay them in full, you will be put on a payment plan.

The Judge ordered you to pay \$100.00 per month on your fines and costs. You may comply with the Judge's order in one of three ways:

- Pay \$100.00 per month (cash, check, money order or credit card).
- Work twelve hours of community service each month and receive credit at \$9.00 per hour.
- Combine monthly payments and monthly community service.



- Today you will be given a payment plan, a payment date, a court date and information about community service.
- After you have paid \$100.00, or worked twelve (12) hours of community service, or a combination of both, the Court will set your next payment date 30 days from your original payment date.

IF YOU FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE JUDGE'S ORDER YOU MUST APPEAR BEFORE HIM ONCE A MONTH TO EXPLAIN WHY YOU ARE NOT COMPLYING.



Example: If your first payment is due on December 15th and you make your payment, your next payment is due on January 15th, and again on the 15th of each month after that until you are paid in full. But if you fail to make your \$100.00 payment, or fail to work community service hours, or fail to do a combination of the both, then you MUST APPEAR BEFORE THE JUDGE on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 11:00 a.m., depending on the date your payment is due.



- With each payment you will be given a new payment due date and a new court date to appear before the Judge.
- If you fail to comply with the payment plan, your case will be sent to collections, blocks put on your license registration privileges and possibly a warrant issued.
- Community service forms are to be turned in to the Probation Department.
