Journal Entry: Requesting a Zoom Hearing in Criminal and Traffic Cases pursuant to Ohio Criminal Rule and Ohio Traffic Rule 2(K)

- A Defendant may request to appear via Zoom rather than in person for arraignments and pre-trial hearings BUT NOT FOR MOTION HEARINGS, BENCH TRIALS OR JURY TRIALS.
- 2. The request must be made by emailing the Clerk of Court AT LEAST ONE BUSINESS DAY BEFORE THE SCHEDULED HEARING: clerkofcourt@mountvernonohio.org
- 3. The Defendant shall provide a valid email address WITH NO ATTACHMENTS.
- 4. The Defendant's name, date of birth, as well as the reason for the request, shall be included in the email.
- 5. All requests will be reviewed for approval by the Judge; typical reasons for granting a request are the Defendant lives too far from the Court to conveniently appear in person, the Defendant cannot miss work or the Defendant does not have a driver's license or reliable transportation.
- 6. Upon approval of a request, the Defendant will be emailed a Zoom link.
- 7. The Defendant shall join the meeting no later than 9:30 a.m., for arraignments and no later than 9:00 a.m. for pre-trial hearings.
- 8. FAILURE TO JOIN THE MEETING ON TIME MAY RESULT IN A WARRANT FOR THE DEFENDANT'S ARREST FOR FAILING TO APPEAR.
- 9. For arraignment hearings only the Defendant shall not mute the Courtroom because an audio recording will be played advising Defendants of their legal rights; the Judge will not repeat the statement of legal rights for you.
- 10. Zoom cases will be heard after all in-person cases in the Courtroom have been heard.
- 11. The Defendant will be asked for name, address, date of birth and the last four digits of the Defendant's social security number to confirm the Defendant's identity.
- 12. Proper courtroom etiquette shall be maintained throughout the hearing:
 - a. Be in a quiet space, free from distractions;
 - b. DO NOT CALL FROM A MOTOR VEHICLE;
 - c. Dress in Courtroom appropriate attire;
 - d. Do not eat, use tobacco products or vape; and
 - e. Allow camera access once your case is called (the Defendant's face must be well-lit and visible without using any filters).
